BYLAW NO. 2017-04. VILLAGE OF AYLESBURY A BYLAW TO PERMIT, REGULATE AND RESTRICT THE KEEPING OF HENS

The Council of the Village of Aylesbury, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- 1. No person shall keep, harbour or permit to remain upon any premises within the Municipality of the Village of Aylesbury which are held by such person as owner, tenant, occupier or which are used by such person, hens greater in number than twelve (12) in aggregate.
- 2. "No person shall keep, harbour or permit to remain upon permitted premises within the Village of Aylesbury more than twelve(12) hens in aggregate"
- "Hens shall be kept for personal use only, and eggs, manure, meat, and other products derived from hens shall not be sold".

"The keeping of roosters is prohibited".

"Hens shall not be slaughtered or euthanized on the property. Hens shall only be disposed of by delivering to a farm, abattoir, veterinarian, or other facility that has the ability to dispose of hens lawfully".

"Hens shall be fully enclosed".

"Hens cannot be free range".

3. Every person who violates a provision of this Bylaw, or consents, allows or permits an act or thing to be done in violation of a provision of this Bylaw, or who neglects to or refrains from doing anything required to be done by a provision of this Bylaw, is guilty of an offence and is liable to the penalties imposed under this Bylaw or any other applicable Bylaw of the Village, and is guilty of a separate offence each day that a violation continues to exist.
